How does the Coronavirus Compare with the Flu? – The flu kills about 0.1% of the people that catch it, while the COVID-19 virus may kill as high as 2% or the same rate as the flu epidemic of 1918. The COVID -19 seems to be more contagious than the flu (each confirmed case infects 2.2 others)

<u>Coronavirus death toll rises to 9 in Washington state</u> – 100 cases in 15 states. Immigration Services closed, lives disrupted across the states due to school closings, event cancelations, etc.

NYC School Shuts Over Coronavirus Fears – Washington State health officials announced four more deaths from the coronavirus; three of the victims were residents of a Seattle-area nursing home

<u>Coronavirus Cases Mount as Second Person Dies in U.S.</u> - Two people die of COVID-19 in the United States – both victims were at a nursing facility in Seattle. Now, there is a confirmed case in NY.

<u>Two new cases of coronavirus in Washington State</u> – Teenager is presumptive positive for COVID-19 closes school and is quarantined for 14 days. Also, two cases in San Francisco found without direct link to travel to foreign hot spots.

<u>First death for coronavirus in the United States confirmed in Washington State</u>. – President urges country to remain calm in the face of the first death in the US from the virus. Travel bans extended. Nursing facility may be reason for epicenter.

<u>Washington state declares state of emergency</u> – more than 50 patients report "respiratory symptoms or hospitalized with pneumonia."

Italy

<u>COVID-19 cases jump in Iran as Italy toll rises: Live updates</u> - Iran announces 205 new infections in last 24 hours as Italian authorities say the number of cases has exceeded 1,000.

South Korea

Over 4,200 infected with COVID-19 in S. Korea, 26 dead — most dead are 50-80 with comorbidities; most isolate themselves because healthcare is overwhelmed.

Iran

<u>COVID-19 cases surge in South Korea, Italy, and Iran</u> - Iran reported 385 more cases, up sharply from 205 reported yesterday, for a total of 978 cases. Eleven more people died, raising Iran's fatality count to 54. Of today's new cases, 170 were from Tehran.

<u>To contain COVID-19</u>, <u>Japan urges companies to let employees work from home</u> – workplace culture in Japan being reexamined to curb spread of virus

United States

<u>Authorities report 2nd coronavirus death in U. S.</u> - 74 cases and two deaths have been confirmed in the U.S.

<u>The Problem with Telling Sick Workers to Stay Home</u> - The culture of the American workplace puts everyone's health at unnecessary risk.

Case Definition

<u>Changes to China's case definition of COVID-19 creates a spike in cases</u> – China adopts a new case definition that now includes both laboratory-confirmed cases and clinically diagnosed cases.

Treatment

<u>NIH clinical trial of remdesivir to treat COVID-19 begins</u> – Remdesivir is a broad-spectrum antiviral treatment previously used to treat Ebola and has shown some success with treating SARS and MERS

Transmission

<u>Spreading 'much faster than I expected'</u> – Covid-19 worries professionals because it is more deadly than the flu and spreads like the flu.

<u>Covid-19 found in urine as well</u> – The State Key Laboratory of Respiratory Diseases working with Zhong Nanshan's team isolated Covid-19 in urine and feces.

Funding

<u>White House to ask Congress for emergency coronavirus funding</u> – Secretary Alex Azar notified Congress need to shift funds to fight virus.

Italy

<u>Europe Confronts Coronavirus as Italy Battles an Eruption of Cases</u> – Venice's carnival celebrations on hold as 10 towns are shut down after 150 Covid-19 cases documented near Milan.

South Korea

<u>Coronavirus: infected health official leading South Korea's fight against Covid-19 is member of Shincheonji Church of Jesus doomsday cult</u> – A senior health official at the forefront of the virus fight found to be member of doomsday cult tests positive for Covid-19.

Iran

<u>Iran reports 12 dead, 61 infected with COVID-19</u>; government pledges transparency - Twelve people have died and 61 people have been infected with COVID-19.

Japan

<u>Rise in COVID-19 cases in Japan prompts travel advisory revisions</u> - Foreign Minister Toshimitsu Motegi confirmed Friday that the nine countries — Israel, the Solomon Islands, Thailand, Samoa, Tonga, Micronesia, Kiribati, Bhutan and South Korea — had issued warnings against travel to Japan.
