	Recommended. Employees should take their temperature before they go to work. If they have a temperature above 100.4F, they should stay home. These employers must ask employees resuming on-premises work to confirm they have not experienced COVID-19 CDC-defined symptoms and to monitor their own symptoms, including cough, shortness of breath, or any two of the additional symptoms enumerated in the guidance.

Face coverings guidelines

Requirement	By May 1, 2020 at 8:00 a.m.: Employers must provide employees with a face covering to wear while working in areas open to the general public and areas in which coming within 6 feet of other staff is likely. All restaurants must require that all employees who interact with customers (including, without limitation, delivery personnel) to wear a face covering while working. Businesses must provide, at their expense, such face coverings as well as hand sanitizer for their employees. All employees are strongly encouraged to use personal face coverings until their employer provides a face covering.
9	All individuals must wear a face covering in specified public places, except where doing so would inhibit that individual's health or where the individual is under two years of age. A business must decline entry to an individual refusing to wear, unless the business is providing medication, medical supplies, or food, in which case the business policy should provide alternate methods of pickup and/or delivery of such goods, or the individual has a medical condition that would prevent them from mask use.
	Employees and customers of reopening hair care services also must wear cloth face masks at all times. Staff must also wear gloves.

Face Coverings Guidelines

Requirement	Residents over age 2 must wear face coverings in public settings, including in essential businesses and on public transportation. The requirement applies to both customers and employees of essential businesses. If a customer refuses to wear a face covering for non-medical reasons, the business may decline entry.

Temperature



Required. Essential businesses and organizations and those that are re-opening all or a portion of their operations must document the temperature of all employees daily before their shift. Employers should take the temperatures of their employees on-site with a non-touch thermometer each day upon the employee arrival at work. If this is not possible, temperatures can be taken before arriving as long as it can sufficiently be authenticated by the employee. Normal temperature should not exceed 100.0F.

Face coverings

	Retail, restaurant, golf course, and personal care services employees <u>must</u> wear cloth face coverings at all times when in the retail facility and in public locations or shared staff areas (e.g. break rooms), even if other individuals are not immediately present.
	Employees of other essential businesses and organizations and those that are re-opening all or a portion of their operations are strongly <u>recommended</u> to wear a cloth face covering while at work and in potential close contact with others.

Requirement	Employers that are essential businesses must provide, at the employer's expense, face coverings for employees to wear when performing work that involves direct contact with customers or members of the public. Any individual who is over age 2 and able to medically tolerate a face-covering shall be <u>required</u> to cover their nose and mouth with a mask or cloth face-covering when in a public place and unable to maintain, o when not maintaining, social distance. NOTE: New York City has its own face covering obligations. In addition, some localities may have provisions concerning face coverings for employees and/or customers. Businesses must implement and ensure compliance with screening all individuals entering the establishment at any time for any reason including, at minimum: (1) visual assessment, self- screening, or a written questionnaire, or a combination of any of these screening methods; and (2) at all entrances to an establishment, notice that all individuals entering must be screened or self- screened, and to not enter if they are COVID-19 positive, have COVID-19 symptoms, or have had close contact with a COVID-19-positive individual.
	Face Coverings Guidelines
Requirement	All employees of customer/client-facing businesses and non-profit organizations, and office-based businesses and non-profits, that are still operating must wear cloth face coverings unless an employee can easily, continuously, and measurably maintain at least 6 feet of distance from other employees for the duration of his or her work. All such businesses must provide, at their expense, face coverings or materials for making of face coverings to their employees. Coverings or materials may be made available staff-wide or individually upon employee request so long as the result is organization-wide use of face coverings. As of May 8, any person in a public place, indoor or outdoors, must cover their mouth or nose with a mask
	or cloth face covering; some exceptions are included in the order. People are required to wear masks in grocery stores, pharmacies, and other retail, as well as in taxis, ride-share services, or public transit.
