


No requirement

Recommended. Employees who appear to have acute respiratory illness symptoms (i.e., cough, shortness of breath) upon arrival to work or become sick during the day should be separated from other employees and be sent home immediately.

#### Face Coverings Guidelines



Beginning May 1, 2020, essential businesses and manufacturers are required to provide face coverings to all employees who are not able to maintain 6 feet of social distancing. People over age 2 must wear a mask or face covering when in a public place and they either cannot or it is impractical to maintain 6 feet of physical distance between themselves and others. NOTE: Many Illinois localities have provisions concerning face coverings for employees and/or customers. Please check for additional information about your particular jurisdiction.

#### **Temperature**

Recommended. Employees with temperatures 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit should be sent home. Employees should be screened before and after each shift. Employers should use

the screening algorithm.

Recommended. Employers should also screen the employees for coughs, sore throats, difficulty breathing and any other respiratory symptoms. Employees should be screened before and after each shift. Employers should use the screening algorithm.



#### Temperature



Required for manufacturing facilities. The employee screening protocol must include temperature screening as soon as no-touch thermometers can be obtained.

Recommended for construction businesses, which must conduct temperature screening "if possible."

#### Health Screen

Required for food selling establishments and pharmacies. Such employers must ask employees symptom and contact screening questions as they report for work.

Required for construction businesses. Conduct a daily entry screening protocol for workers and visitors entering the worksite, including a questionnaire covering symptoms and exposure to people with possible COVID-19, together with, if possible, a temperature screening.

Required for manufacturing facilities, which must conduct a daily entry screening protocol for workers, contractors, suppliers, and any other individuals entering the facility, including a questionnaire covering symptoms and suspected or confirmed exposure to people with possible COVID-19. Manufacturers must also create dedicated entry point(s) at every facility for daily screening and ensure physical barriers are in place to prevent anyone from bypassing the screening. NOTE: Some Michigan localities have provisions concerning employee health screenings.

#### **Face Coverings Guidelines**

#### Requirement



All businesses and operations whose workers perform in-person work must, at a minimum, provide non-medical grade face coverings to their workers, as well as gloves, goggles, face shields as appropriate for the activity being performed. Food selling establishments and pharmacies must require checkout employees to wear face coverings. Construction businesses must require face shields or masks to be worn when workers cannot consistently maintain 6 feet of separation from other workers, and must encourage or require the use of work gloves, as appropriate. Any individual able to medically tolerate a face covering must wear a covering over his or her nose and mouth when in any enclosed public space. NOTE: In Michigan, some localities have provisions concerning face coverings for employees and/or customers. Please check with for additional information about your particular jurisdiction.
